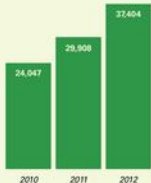

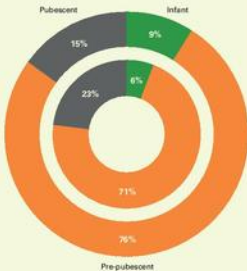

Volume of CSAM* reports exchanged between hotlines

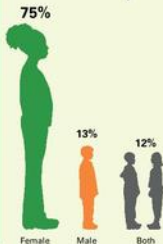


Age of victims

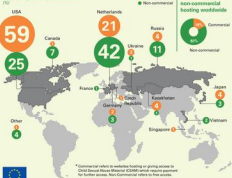
