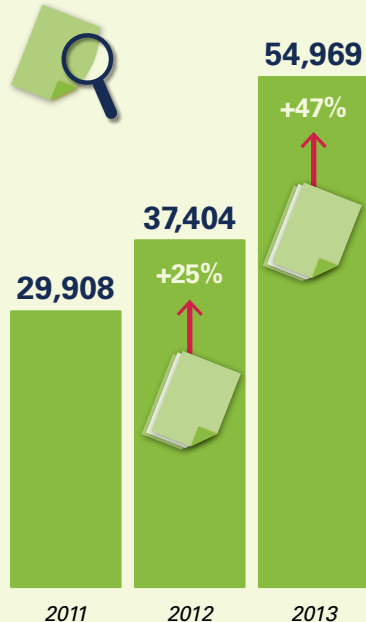

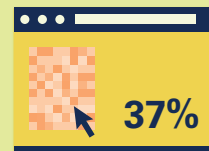
Volume of CSAM reports inserted into IHRMS*

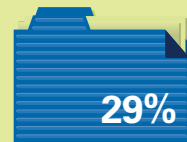

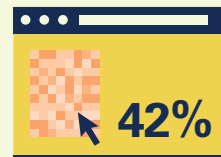

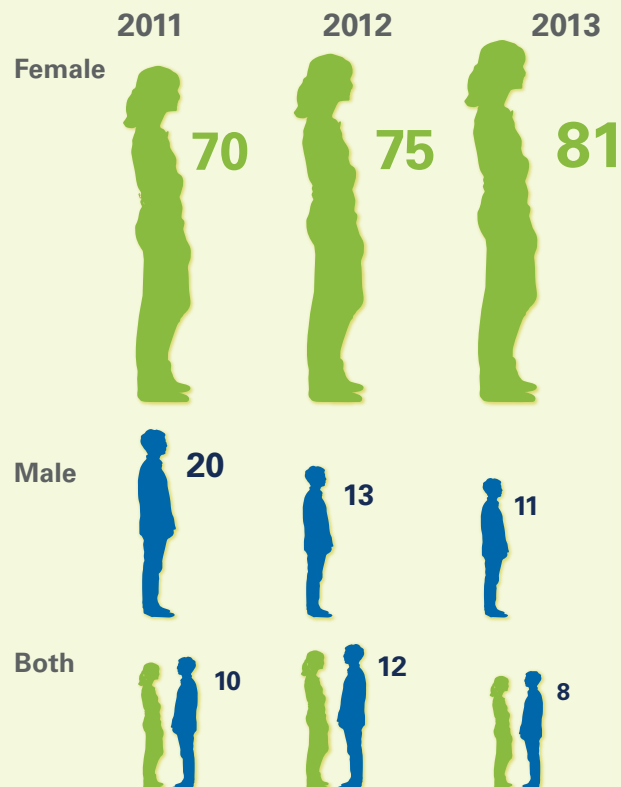
Profiles of the victims

Age (%)

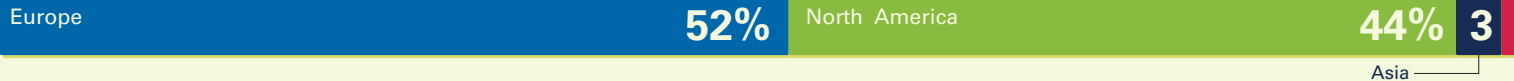

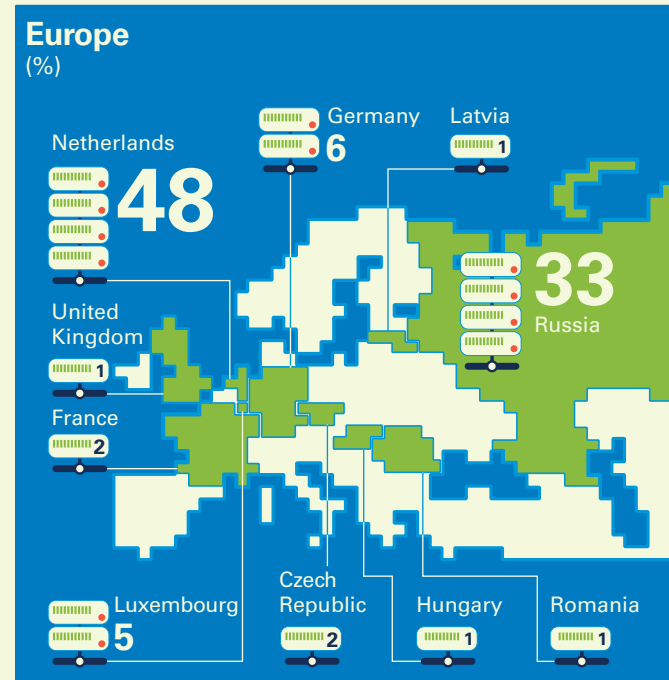
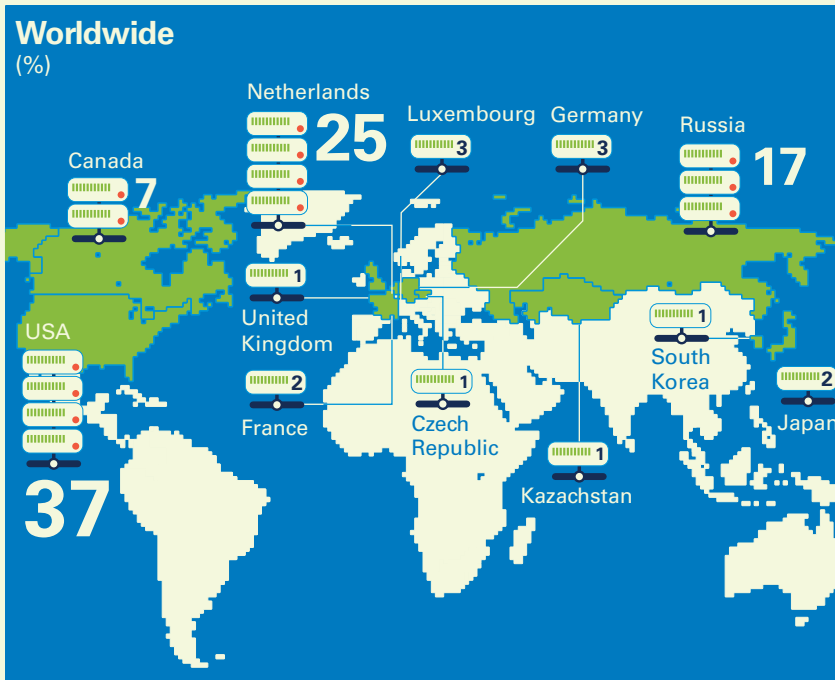


Hosting of Child Sexual Abuse Material

Hosting in countries with INHOPE member hotlines



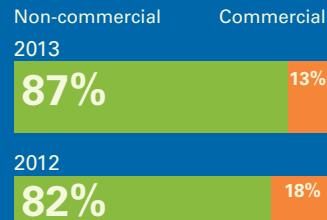
Hosting in non-INHOPE countries (%)

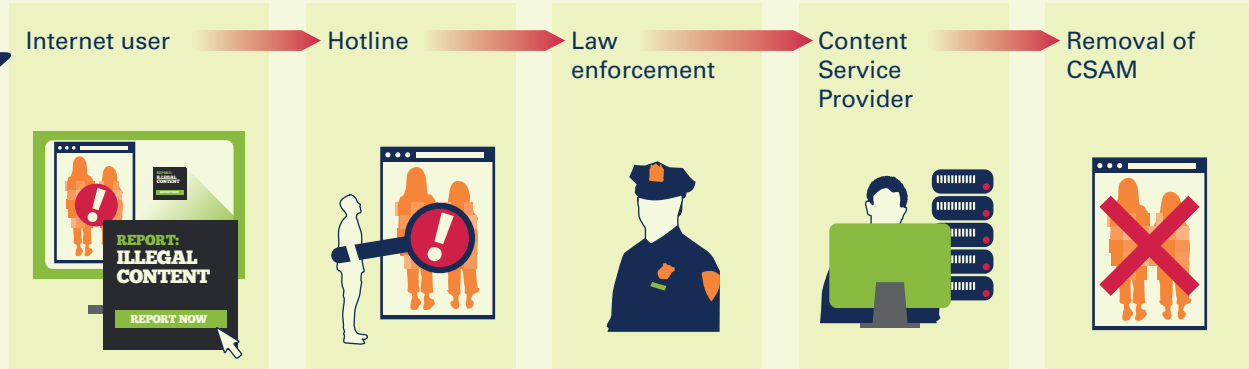

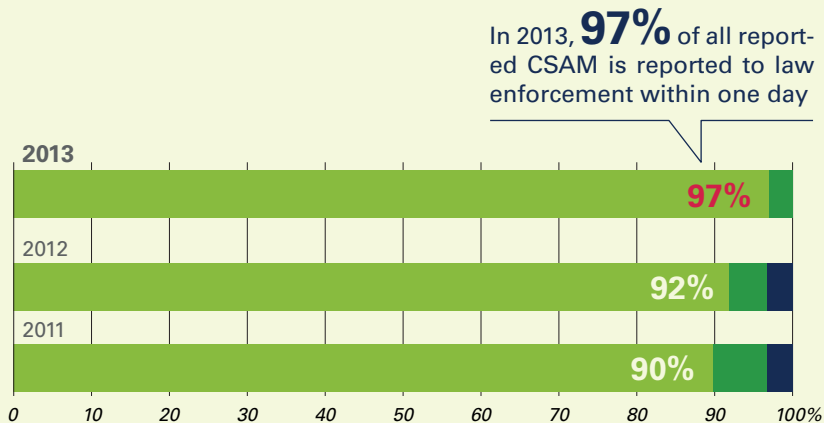

How can one single report to a hotline help make a difference?



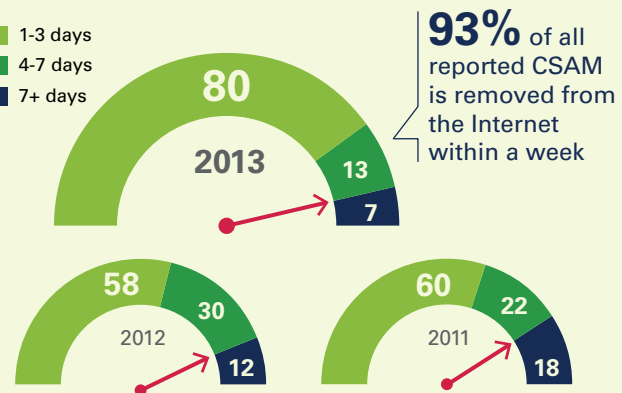
Hotline reports to law enforcement
